Town Pride

As the 2009 National Communities in Bloom winning community, Gibbons boasts many distinctive features. A mere 15 minute drive from Edmonton's north-east boundary, this forward looking community takes pride in its wealth of facilities and recreational opportunities.

Tot lots and active parks dot the town. The fully developed River Valley with structured pathways, benches, a picnic area and numerous viewing points allow residents to bask in the valley's serenity. For the fisherman, the fishpond located in Echo Glen Park is stocked annually with trout.

First class educational, health care, religious institutions, service clubs, community and cultural organizations add to the quality of life in the community.

A dynamic, affordable community nestled in a pastoral setting Gibbons is known for its green spaces and environmental reserves. Residents of the Town take pride in their heritage while maintaining a strong forward thinking attitude built on working cooperatively with their neighbours.

Gibbons has many exciting projects on the horizon. Council is studying the feasibility of building a Multicultural Center. It will connect the existing arena and curling complex, to create a convention type centre. The new community banquet room will accommodate 450 guests and double as a gymnasium for fitness programs, sports and walking on inclement days.

Jack Hogg Park houses ball diamonds, soccer fields, an outdoor skating rink and skateboard park. The Town sports eight other municipal parks, most with playground structures. They host the Town's gazebo, outdoor skating ice, spray park, basketball, four square and tennis courts, soccer fields, trout pond and Country Cone Ice Cream Shop.

Oliver Park is home to the Gibbons Historical Museum. It hosts many turn of the century buildings filled with fascinating equipment, tools and artifacts.

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
The Shack, the Gibbons Youth Centre, allows youth to participate in sports, games, music or just visit with friends in a safe supervised environment.


The Town prides itself on being a walkable community. It's laced with passive trails which interconnect with much of the community. Two kilometres of riverside trails allow walkers to enjoy the Sturgeon Valley's beauty.

The community boasts over 70 volunteer organizations, from a playschool group to the seniors club, which offer activities for all ages and backgrounds and work to maintain the town's homey feel.

Numerous family celebrations run throughout the year, starting with Family Day and wrapping up with a Home Town Christmas.

The world class Goose Hummock Golf Resort is located a mere three kilometres north. Right next door, Jurassic Forest roars with life. Longriders, a full-service campground, hugs the river valley on the north side of town. Across the river, Boonstock rocks a weekend away every summer.






The Town of Gibbons has a vibrant stable population. The median age of its citizens is 33.1, and almost 70 percent of residents over age 5 have lived in Gibbons for 5 years or more.

The Town is located in the heart of Sturgeon County (population 18,620 in 2006) only 15 minutes from City of Edmonton's northern boundary and only 6 kilometres Alberta's from Heartland. The Town's trade area includes traffic on highway 28A from Edmonton as well as highway 28; the highway to Fort McMurray. The Town of Bon Accord (population 1,534 in 2006) is situated only 8 kilometres west of town.

Location:

Gibbons' has a full service Seniors Lodge, Spruceview Manor, which has the capacity to house forty-four residents. Pinecrest Gardens offers eighteen selfcontained apartment suites right next to the lodge.

The town has a variety of religious organizations, including the Anglican Church, United Church, Catholic Church and Sturgeon Alliance Church.

Gibbons is served by a professionally-trained volunteer Fire Department which provides excellent fire protection and emergency response to residents in Gibbons and surrounding area. The Fire Department operates a 1050 G.P.M. fire cannon and an Emergency Rescue Unit which contains the Jaws of Life.

Alberta Health Ambulance Service is located within the Town and there are 3 hospitals within 24 kilometers of Gibbons. The Town is also serviced by Stars Air Ambulance.

Medical facilities consist of two medical clinics, a dental office, a full service pharmacy, a laboratory and a health unit.

Gibbons Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) works to promote and enhance family and community life within the region. Volunteerism and prevention are emphasized; as FCSS strives to help the community help itself.

With the assistance of the Sunflower Community Resource Program, also housed in Gibbons, FCSS offers information, referrals and support for social, community or personal issues. Confidentiality is always protected.

> FCSS also offers many local programs including Meals on Wheels, group photocopying for local non-profit organizations, a babysitting registry, babysitting safety courses, seniors and handicapped

transportation programs as well as many other programs to support local residents.

In an emergency, the Town, partners with the Fire Department to maintain a comprehensive Emergency Management Plan and emergency siren alarm system;


ONE ALARM - means assistance is required. If available report to the Fire Hall, corner of 50th Avenue and 49th Street.


THREE ALARMS - means the situation is all clear report back to the Fire Hall.


CONTINUOUS ALARM for one minute, then quiet for one minute, then repeated means a natural disaster. Please listen for information to be given via loud hailer, if time permits. Announcements may also be delivered over the Alberta Emergency Public Warning system on local television and radio stations.











Gibbons Public Library

Gibbons Public Library is a member of the Northern Lights Library System, which is part of TRAC (The Regional Automation Consortium) a group of four Alberta regional library systems. TRAC facilitates the sharing of resources between more than 150 libraries giving patrons access to a combined catalogue of nearly 3 million books, DVDs and other material.

Gibbons Public Library and the Sturgeon Learning Centre are both Community Internet Access Sites which allow residents to surf the Internet free of charge. The Gibbons Library has three Community Access computers while the Sturgeon Learning Centre has six. The library also offers patrons wireless internet access.



Education

The Town is served by the Sturgeon School Division, with two schools; Landing Trail providing education for kindergarten to grades four and Gibbons School serving children in grades five to nine. High School education is provided at either the Sturgeon Composite High School, at Namao or Redwater High School in Redwater.

Gibbons is also the home of the Sturgeon Learning Centre, an alternative high school which provides high school credit courses in a flexible, individualized, adult learning type environment. Advanced education such as University, Technical School and College Courses are all available within easy commuting distance in Edmonton. Preschool, after school care and day care are also available within the town.

Creating Better Communities

Our commitment goes far beyond providing financial services—we also re-invest our time, energy and resources in the communities where we work and live. Let's talk.

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Outside Services

A great believer in working cooperatively with their neighbours, the Town receives its water supply from the City of Edmonton through its membership with the Capital Region Northeast Water Services Commission. It is also a member of the Alberta Capital Region Wastewater Commission, giving the Town water and wastewater services to meet the needs of a population of 10,000.

Curbside garbage and blue bag collection services are provided within the town. For oversized loads the Roseridge Waste Management Service Commission operates a regional landfill facility just outside the Town of Morinville, about 20 kilometres west of Gibbons. The town subsidises the first 1,000 kg of household refuse,

per household taken to the landfill each year. The town also sponsors a town-wide clean up once a year and works with the county to offer residents a Toxic Waste Round Up.

As well as biweekly curbside blue bag collection, the town operates a seasonal branch and lawn waste compost at the Town's shop.

The winner of the 2009 Communities in Bloom National Contest, Gibbons is also proactive in conservation projects. Some projects undertaken have been the sale of personal composters and rain barrels, sale of flower barrels and the Mayor's Conservation Walk.

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
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
